Chinatown: Our Narrative Tours (CONTOURS)

Chinatown: Our Narrative Tours (CONTOURS) is looking for a core group of people passionate about telling their own stories of Chinatown. They welcome students (high school, higher ed, etc.), researchers, interested community members, residents, bilingual or non-English speaking- anyone who is interested and believes in their objectives- to join! They are frustrated with the public and local perception of Chinatown, as a neighborhood with little merit. Tourists come for eateries and commercial centers, and non-local tour guides speak about Chinatown as if it were a neighborhood stuck in the past. CONTOURS will assemble and train members of the community to lead tours of Chinatown. They will outreach, operate, and coordinate tour groups. Their hope is to compensate tour guides hourly for their time, and to be able to donate to community organizations serving Chinatown grassroots. They will strive to have an emphasis on community building, passion for nuanced storytelling, and the desire to claim the space to tell our neighborhood's stories.
