### **From the Cultural Revolution to Tiananmen Square**

*Date: 11/14/16*

You can't miss this rare New York appearance by novelist Madeleine Thien, whose ambitious novel of contemporary Chinese history--Do Not Say We Have Nothing (W.W. Norton 2016)--is a finalist for this year's Man Booker Prize and the Governor General's Literary Award, Canada's Highest Literary Prize. An epic, magisterial story, the ambitious, sweeping novel engages with two of the most violent moments in recent Chinese history: the Cultural Revolution and the Tiananmen Square protests. She'll discuss the book with New Yorker staff writer Jiayang Fan, who complimented Thien's "mastery" in writing a "powerfully expansive" novel spanning "seven decades and three generations" of Chinese history in a rave review in the New York Times. This event is opened to the public and located at the Asian American Writers' Workshop (112 W 27th Street New York, New York 10001).

### APIASF Scholarship Program

The APIASF General Scholarship Application for the 2017-2018 academic year is now available! Create an account and start your application now at <https://portal.apiasf.org/>. The application deadline is January 11, 2017 at 11:59 PM ET. The application is open to new or continuing undergraduate students attending a U.S. accredited college or university in the Fall of 2017. Scholarship awards range from one-time \$2,500 awards to multi-year \$20,000 awards. APIASF provides scholarships to underserved Asian American Pacific Islander students with a special focus on those who live at or below the poverty level, or are otherwise of low socioeconomic status; are the first in their families to attend college; are representative of the AAPI community's diversity, geographically and ethnically, especially those ethnicities that have been underrepresented on college campuses due to limited access and opportunity; and have placed strong emphasis on community service and leadership as well as solid academic achievement. The APIASF General Scholarship Program application must be completed online and submitted electronically once all of the required questions have been answered. You do not have to complete the online application in one sitting. Until you are ready to submit, you may access your application and edit your answers as many times as you like with your login from any computer with internet access.

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### Chinese/Taiwanese Perspectives on Mental Health Research Study

A graduate student at Clark University, Emily He, is conducting a research study under the supervision of Dr. Esteban V. Cardemil, Professor of Psychology to understand the opinions of Chinese/Taiwanese people after they have read a short story about a young Chinese individual who is experiencing various life challenges along with changes in thinking and behavior. They are hoping to learn more about how Chinese/Taiwanese and/or Chinese/Taiwanese Americans perceive individuals who are experiencing these life changes. The survey should take about **30 minutes or less** of your time. You will be asked to read a short story, answer some questions and give your opinion on Chinese/Taiwanese people in your community. You may feel uncomfortable reading the story and/or when answering questions in the survey, so please keep in mind that **your participation is completely voluntary**. You may withdraw from the study anytime you wish to do so. Participants will be entered to win one of four \$25 Visa gift cards. E-mail addresses entered for the raffle will be kept separate from survey responses which will remain anonymous. Participants must be 18 years of age or older and self-identify as Chinese/Taiwanese and/or Chinese/Taiwanese American.
